

















Michael Antonovich Los Angeles County Supervisor, MTA

Michael D. Antonovich, a native of Los Angeles County, has served the two million residents of the County's Fifth Supervisorial District for more than 30 years. The District includes all or part of the San Gabriel, Pomona, San Fernando, Santa Clarita, and Antelope Valleys.

As a government/history teacher for the Los Angeles Unified School District in 1966, Mike credits his fifth grade teacher for the inspiration to enter public

life. In 1969, he was elected to the Los Angeles Community College Board of Trustees. In 1972, he was elected to serve in the California State Assembly. He served three terms and rose to the rank of Republican Whip from 1976 to 1978. Presidents Ronald Reagan and George Bush appointed Mike to numerous presidential committees and commissions.

In 1980, Mike was elected to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. His 30 years as a Supervisor have been characterized by his commitment to public safety, effective and responsive representation, and support for small business, our County's foster children, seniors, and veterans. He also serves on the Board of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, Metrolink (Southern California Regional Rail Authority), Southern California Association of Governments, San Fernando Valley and San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments, and the South Coast Air Quality Management District.

Supervisor Antonovich resides in Glendale with his wife Christine Hu, their son, Michael Jr. and daughter, Mary Christine.



Jeff Kightlinger General Manager, Metropolitan Water District of Southern California

Jeffrey Kightlinger is general manager for The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. He is responsible for implementing the policy directives of the Board, including working with elected officials and member agencies to carry out the Metropolitan's mission.

Kightlinger was appointed general manager in February 2006. Prior to his appointment, he was general counsel for Metropolitan. He was responsible for directing Metropolitan's legal staff and consulting attorneys; leading the district's legal strategies in pending and potential litigation; and protecting Metropolitan's interests in all legal matters. Previously, Kightlinger represented Metropolitan in environmental issues and water right matters. Before joining Metropolitan in 1995, he worked in private practice representing numerous public agencies.

Kightlinger earned a bachelor's degree in history from the University of California, Berkeley in 1981 and a law degree from the Santa Clara University Law School in 1985.





Gregory E. DiLoreto, P.E., PLS, D.WRE, F.ASCE ASCE President 2013

Greg DiLoreto is the Chief Executive Officer of the Tualatin Valley Water District located in metropolitan Portland Oregon. He has worked in the public works field for 34 years, 17 years as a public works director/city engineer. Mr. DiLoreto holds a B.S. degree in Civil Engineering from Oregon State University and a Masters degree in Public Administration from Portland State University. He is registered as a civil and environmental engineer and a professional land surveyor in Oregon. Mr. DiLoreto is a fellow in the American Society of

Civil Engineers. He served on the ASCE Board of Directors 2004-06. He has received the 1986 ASCE Edmund Friedman Young Engineer Award, the 1995 ASCE Oregon Section Outstanding Civil Engineer Award, and the 2005 ASCE Government Engineer of the Year Award. In 2003 he was inducted into the Oregon State University Academy of Distinguished Engineers.



Dan Richard Chair, California High Speed Rail Authority

Dan Richard of Piedmont, has been a principal of Dan Richard Advisors since 2010. He was managing partner and co-founder of Heritage Oak Capital Partners, an infrastructure finance firm, from 2007 to 2009 and was senior vice president of public policy and governmental relations at Pacific Gas and Electric Company from 1997 to 2006.

Richard was an elected member of the San Francisco Bay Area Rapid Transit District from 1992 to 2004, where he served twice as president of the Board. At the Bay Area Rapid Transit District, Richard led efforts to secure \$4 billion in capital for system rehabilitation projects, the transit system's expansion to the San Francisco Airport, and seismic retrofit programs.

Richard was a principal at Morse, Richard, Weisenmiller & Associates from 1986 to 1996, a firm serving the independent power industry and project finance lending community. He was vice president of Independent Power Corporation from 1983 to 1986. Richard served as Governor Brown's deputy legal affairs secretary from 1982 to 1983 and deputy assistant for science and technology from 1978 to 1979. He was advisor to the chairman of the California Energy Commission from 1978 to 1982.

Richard began his career at National Aeronautics and Space Administration, where he was assistant to the deputy associate administrator from 1972 to 1978. Richard received his Juris Doctor degree from McGeorge School of Law.


