Community Service Committee (CSC)

A. Introduction

- 1. **Charge -** The Orange County Branch Community Service Committee will develop local community service events for ASCE members to participate in. The committee will also look for opportunities to assist/partner with Engineers Without Borders USA (EWB-USA) Orange County either locally or internationally.
- 2. Goals
 - Develop a local community service project.
 - Look for an opportunity to start a Community Engineering Corps (CEC) project locally.
 - Alert members when EWB-USA OC needs assistance with their international projects
 - Partner once a year with the Orange County Branch Younger Member Forum (YMF) and/or student chapters on a community service project (Potentially Corazon, Rebuilding Together, etc.)
- 3. **Branch Award Category -** Professional Activities/Scholarships/Awards-Recognition Programs and Special Section/Branch Events & Activities

B. Membership

- 1. **Committee Makeup** The committee will be led by a chair who preferably has a professional license in Civil Engineering and experience with community service projects.
 - *a.* Local Community Service Subcommittee coordinate the activities for the local community service project.
 - *b.* CEC Subcommittee coordinate a CEC project.
- 2. **Leadership and Organization** The committee is led by a chair who work oversees the activities of the subcommittees.
- 3. **Committee Appointments** The president of the Orange County Branch appoints the chair typically based on recommendations by members of the committee each year.
- C. **Procedures -** The Committee shall function in accordance with the Orange County Branch Constitution and Bylaws, and the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order - Newly Revised.
- **D. Budget -** The Orange County Branch will budget funds to support this committee. The funds will be reimbursed in accordance with the Orange County Branch's reimbursement policy

 - Winter, 2015 Conduct a 15-30 minute session of the ASCE-OC Board to discuss the types and value of projects they would like to see developed
 - Spring, 2015 Investigate potential projects
 - Summer, 2015 Propose a list of projects (1-3) for implementation including potential cost, schedule and community value
- EWB-OC Potential Assistance Attend the EWB-OC Board meetings on a quarterly basis
- ASCE-OC YMF Coordinate with the YMF in Spring, 2015
